
Sub: Engagement of Manpower in 181 MVU under ESVHD

Sir,

With reference to the subject cited above it is to inform that in order to further strengthen the livestock services at farmer's doorstep 181 Mobile Veterinary Units under CSS ESVHD (one MVU for each **one lakh** of livestock population), will be made operational shortly. The movement of these MVUs will be monitored through a centralised call centre with unique short Code no. "1962. To provide veterinary services each MVU will have one Veterinarian, one Para-veterinarian & one Driver -cum-Attendant. These personnel will be arranged through service providers at district level.

Hence you are requested to invite sealed bids from the eligible bidders for providing the services of MVU as per the district requirement. An indicative bid document is enclosed for reference. On receipt of the MVU vehicles the personnel will be engaged & agreement with the selected service provider should be made accordingly. Further an activity time line is also enclosed for smooth & timely completion of the engagement process.



ESTABLISHMENT OF MOBILE VETERINARY UNIT UNDER ESVHD FOR THE YEAR 2022-23

1. Background

The livestock sector in State is fast growing and has a high socio-economic multiplier effect due to the wide-ranging activities linked to livestock production and marketing. The livestock productivity can be enhanced with improved & timely provision of Veterinary Services.

Hence there's a need to ensure delivery of effective livestock healthcare services for saving the livestock wealth of the State by carrying out treatment, immunization against commonly encountered preventable diseases, awareness programmes, strengthening diagnostic facilities for prevention and control of diseases in animals and birds. The task has become more crucial in the context of newly reported exotic diseases in the country along with recurrent outbreak of Avian Influenza.

To cater to the livestock healthcare needs there functions 541 Veterinary Hospitals & Dispensaries and 3239 Livestock Aid Centers in the state. The problem faced by the livestock owners is to bring their animal to the nearby veterinary hospital, dispensary or Livestock Aid Centre for treatment. To address the problem of livestock healthcare service delivery in effective ways, it is proposed to adopt Mobile Veterinary Services. Mobile Veterinary Units facilitated with Call Centre will definitely cater to the need of the livestock owners.

2. Objectives:

To ensure delivery of effective basic livestock healthcare services at the time of emergency on field site.

3. Process flow:

i. Establishment of 181 MVUs

The state has 181.70 lakh of livestock. Considering one MVU for each **one lakh** of livestock population, it is planned to run 181 MVUs in the state. At present the State has 314 MVUs @ one in each Block. But these MVUs run according to pre-approved tour plans and are not adequate to provide livestock healthcare delivery extensively in all the areas of the State. To provide better **emergency** healthcare services as and when needed by the livestock farmers, **181 MVUs** will operate. It will ensure timely and prompt delivery of veterinary service at the site, to the right animal patient, with proper veterinary care. 181 vehicles will be procured and will be stationed at designated Block VDs/ Sub Divisional Veterinary Hospital/ Dist. Veterinary Hospitals. The district wise allocation of MVUs are as detailed below. The name of blocks to station the MVUs will be finalized by the concerned CDVOs.

ii. Call Center

When a distress call from the livestock owner is received at any time of the day at the call center, basic details are collected and information disseminated to the nearest Mobile Veterinary Unit from where the call is received. The Veterinary Doctor in the call center will ascertain the type of emergency and either provides Online Veterinary health care Direction (OLVD) or directs to dispatch the mobile van. The mobile van along with the Veterinary Doctor reaches the doorstep of the livestock owner, assesses the condition of the sick animal and provides on-site treatment. One call center for all 181 MVUs with unique short Code no. "1962" will operate from Veterinary Officers Training Institute, Laxmisagar, Bhubnaeswar. The Call centers will be operated on collaboration with **OCAC** (Odisha Computer Application Center) at present.

iii. Man Power requirement for Running of Mobile Veterinary Unit

Each MVU will have one Veterinarian, one Para-veterinarian & one Driver -cum-Attendant. These personnel will be arranged through service providers at district level.

Job description of outsourced personnel:

A. Veterinary Doctors

- i. Receive the call from designated call center
- ii. Attend the livestock in the assigned place
- iii. Render applicable veterinary services
- iv. Refer the case to the nearest Veterinary dispensary/ Vety. Hospital in case of requirement
- v. Work as per advise of assigned Block Veterinary Officer
- vi. Perform other Veterinary service related works (Like vaccination, AI, Health camps, necessity in case of natural calamities etc.) as assigned when not in call.
- vii. Monitor the work of Livestock assistant & driver -cum- attendant.
- viii. Submit Monthly report returns to BVO & other higher authorities as & when required.
- ix. Attend review meetings.
- x. Any other duties relating to Veterinary service as & when required

ii. Call Center

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- vi. Perform other Veterinary service related works (Like vaccination, AI, Health camps, necessity in case of natural calamities etc.) as assigned when not in call.
- vii. Monitor the work of Livestock assistant & driver -cum- attendant.
- viii. Submit Monthly report returns to BVO & other higher authorities as & when required.
- ix. Attend review meetings.
- x. Any other duties relating to Veterinary service as & when required

B. Livestock Assistant

- i. Attend the livestock in the assigned place with Veterinary doctor or alone in case of requirement
- ii. Assist in providing applicable veterinary services
- iii. May provide Veterinary first aid services
- iv. Refer the case to the nearest Veterinary dispensary/ Vety. Hospital in case of requirement
- v. Work as per advice of assigned Block Veterinary Officer
- vi. Perform other Veterinary service-related works (Like vaccination, AI, Health camps, necessity in case of natural calamities etc.) as assigned when not in call.
- vii. Assist in submission of Monthly report returns to BVO & other higher authorities as & when required.
- viii. Attend review meetings when required.
- ix. Any other duties relating to Veterinary service as & when required

C. Driver cum Attendant

- i. Drive & assist in attending the livestock in the assigned place with Veterinary doctor or livestock assistant.
- ii. Assist in providing applicable veterinary services
- iii. Work as per advice of assigned Block Veterinary Officer
- iv. Assist the Veterinary doctor / Livestock Assistant Perform other Veterinary service related works (Like vaccination, AI, Health camps, necessity in case of natural calamities etc.) as assigned when not in call.
- v. Any other duties relating to Veterinary service as & when required

NB: All statutory charges toward engagement of Human resources to the MVUs by the service provider like EPF, ESI, etc. shall be covered under the cost mentioned against each post.

4. Modalities for engaging the Service providing Agency

- i. The service provider should be a **Non-Government Organization** having experience in providing manpower services to different organisations including Govt. institutions.
- ii. The respective CDVOs will float Expression of Interests (EOI) from interested and eligible service provider in each district. Accordingly, the organizations can apply giving the choice for district/districts, based on their field experience and geographical coverage. An indicative bid document for empanelment of the service provider is placed at **Annexure-A**
- iii. One service provider will be engaged for each district, which will support all blocks in the district by providing required manpower in each category.
- iv. The service provider for each district will make an agreement with the respective Chief District Veterinary Officer (CDVO).
- v. Selection of the required manpower will be done by the service provider, by inviting open advertisement and the applications received will be scrutinized and shortlisted by the service provider. The shortlisted candidates will be finally selected through a Selection Committee consisting of CDVO, SDVO, ADVOs / DD, VH, 2 Block Veterinary Officers and service provider Representative.
- vi. Thereafter, the service provider will deploy the required manpower to each MVU of the district.
- vii. One agreement mentioning Terms of Reference for engaging the service provider will be made by the respective CDVO.

5. Indicative Role of CDVOs

1. The Chief District Veterinary Officer will Invite sealed bids from the eligible bidders for providing the services of MVU as per the district requirement.
2. Finalise the locations (BVD/SDVH/DVH) for MVUs allotted for their respective district looking at the geographical situation, road connectivity to attend the call at the farthest village in least possible time etc. through a dist. Level team involving SDVOs, DDVH & ADVOs. Suggestions from DC section of the directorate may also be taken if required.
3. Interview the manpower sponsored by service provider & finalise the personnel to be engaged for each MVU.

4. Keep the undertaking from each personnel with respect to **“The persons deployed by the service provider shall not have any claim whatsoever like employer and employee relationship against the Authority under this service.”** For all intents and purposes, the Service Provider shall be the “Employer” within the meaning of different Rules & Acts in respect of persons deployed.
5. . To keep an undertaking from the service provider that, the manpower to be deployed by the Service Provider should not have any adverse Police records/criminal cases against them prior to signing of the agreement.
6. Sign the agreement with the service provider mentioning all terms & conditions in non-judicial stamp paper.
7. To verify the bills raised by service provider with the attendance sheet/performance report duly verified by the respective BVO/ DD, DVH (officer concerned) in respect of the persons deployed prior to release of monthly remuneration of deployed personnel to the service provider.
8. To verify whether the Service Provider have deposited the remuneration of the deployed manpower for the concerned billing period in their respective bank account through online transfer and submit the details for necessary records prior to release of the payment of succeeding month.
9. Monitor the performance of deployed staff from service provider & in case of incompetency's should ask the service provider to replace.
10. Submit the monthly report returns to the Directorate on monthly basis & as per requirement in the following report format at **Annexure-B**.

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SECTION-I

Instruction to Bidders

A. General Information:

1. Chief District Veterinary Officer, ^{Kanghar}..... requires the services of reputed, well established, financially sound and registered Service Providers to provide manpower (one Veterinarian, one para-veterinarian & one Driver-cum attendant for each MVU) by deploying adequately trained and disciplined man power for MVUs in the district of ^{Kanghar}.....District as per the requirement indicated in **Annexure-I**.
2. The period of contract for providing the aforesaid service will be ideally **2 years** from the date of effectiveness of the contract and extendable annually up to 2024-25. The contract may be extended for a period, not exceeding the original duration of the contract on mutual consent depending upon the performance of the Service Provider and at the discretion of the authority. The authority reserves the right to terminate the contract at any time after giving 30 days' notice to the service Provider.
3. The interested bidders may visit the Chief District Veterinary Officer, on any working day between the office hours to have a thorough knowledge of the work to be performed before preparation and submission of the bid.

B. Submission of Bid:

The complete proposal in all respects as specified must be accompanied with a Non-refundable amount of Rs. 2,000/- (Rupees Two Thousand) only towards **Bid Processing Fee** in form of **Demand Draft** in favour of " **Chief District Veterinary Officer, Keonjhar** ", drawn in any scheduled commercial bank and payable at **Keonjhar** failing which the bid will be out rightly rejected. The bid should be sent through Speed Post/Registered Post/ Courier so as to reach the authority by due date & time.

The authority will not be responsible for any postal delay. Bids without bid processing fee shall be rejected. Bids submitted after due date will be summarily rejected. The bidder should submit the 'Bid Security Declaration form' as per Annexure-II in lieu of Bid security/ EMD.

The bid has been invited under two bid systems i.e Technical Bid and Financial Bid. The bidders are advised to submit two separate envelopes super scribing "**Technical Bid**" (name of the service) and "**Financial Bid**" (name of the service). Both sealed envelopes must be kept in a third sealed envelope super-scribing "Bid for Outsourcing of services of MVUs"

Selected bidder will have to deposit a Performance Security of Rs. 30,000/- (Rs. Thirty thousand) only per MVU commensurate with the number for MVUs to be engaged in the district in form of Bank Guarantee from any scheduled Bank situated within Odisha in favour of concerned **Chief District Veterinary Officer** as per the prescribed format provided in the tender document at **Section - IX** for a period of three months beyond the contract period. (i.e. Performance Bank Guarantee must be valid from the date of effectiveness of the contract to a period of three months beyond the contract period) as its commitment to perform services under the contract. Failure to comply with the requirements shall constitute sufficient grounds for forfeiture of the Performance Bank Guarantee. The Performance Bank Guarantee shall be released immediately after three months of expiry of the contract provided that there is no breach of contract on the part of the qualified bidder. No interest shall be paid on the Performance Bank Guarantee. In case, the contract is further extended beyond the initial contract period, the Bank Guarantee will have to be accordingly renewed by the deployed service provider as per the existing terms and conditions of the tender.

Any deviation from the prescribed procedures / required information / formats/ conditions shall result in out-right rejection of the bid. Any conditional bid shall be out-rightly rejected.

All entries along with the pages in the bid document should be legible, filled- in clearly and signed by the authorized representative. If the space for furnishing information is insufficient, a separate sheet duly signed by the authorized signatory should be attached.

The technical Bid will be opened on ~~-----~~ ¹²⁻¹⁰⁻²⁰²² at 11.00 AM in presence of the authorized representatives of the bidder who wish to be present on the spot at that time. Financial bid of the technically qualified bidders shall be opened on ~~15-10-2022~~ ¹²⁻¹⁰⁻²⁰²² at 11 AM in presence of the authorized representatives.

The EMD shall be forfeited if the successful bidder fails to undertake the work or fails to comply with any of the terms and conditions of the bid.

The bid shall be valid for a period of **90 days** from the date of opening of the bids and no request for any variation in quoted rates and/withdrawal of bids on any ground by the bidder shall be entertained. Validity of the bids can be extended on mutual consent.

To assist in the analysis, evaluation and computation of bids, the authority may ask the bidders individually for clarification of their bids. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing but no change in the price or substance of the bid offered shall be permitted.

The bidder shall be evaluated on QCBS (Quality and Cost based Selection) as (80: 20)

The bidder having minimum 60 marks in the technical criteria would be considered for further evaluation on QCBS (Quality & Cost based selection).

QCBS evaluation will be as 80:20 where 80 % weightage shall be to technical score and 20% weightage shall be to the financial score.

- Financial score of Individual bidder shall be as (FS): L1 (Lowest Quote)/ Bidder Quote * 0.20
- QCBS score of each of the bidder will be evaluated as **QCBS= "TS+FS"**

Bidder with the Highest Score in the QCBS shall be declared as H1 and will be the best qualified bidder for the award of contract.

The quoted rates shall not be less than the minimum wages fixed/notified by the Government of Odisha from time to time and shall include all statutory obligations.

The service provider shall be liable for all kinds of dues payable in respect of manpower deployed / provided under the contract and the authority shall not be liable for any dues for availing the services of the personnel.

The authority reserves the right to reject any or all bids and terminate the tender process without assigning any reason thereof.

SECTION-II

SCOPE OF THE WORK

A. SERVICES OF MVU

1. The Chief District Veterinary Officer, Keonjhar Invites sealed bids from the eligible bidders for providing the services of MVU at locations as per **Annexure-I**.
2. The man power for the MVU services shall be round the clock. They have to stay at allotted location. However, the deployment of the personnel may be varied with respect to requirement as per the convenience of the Authority.
3. The Service Provider shall ensure that the personnel deputed are as per the scope of the work, physically and mentally healthy and not more than 65 years of age or less than 21 years of age.
4. The full particulars of the personnel to be deployed by the service provider including their names and addresses shall be furnished along with testimonials before they are actually deployed for the job.
5. A senior level representative of the Service provider shall visit the Mobile Veterinary Unit of the concerned district in every fortnight and review the service performance of its personnel. During the fortnight visit, Service provider's representative will also meet the representative of the Authority dealing with service under the contract for mutual feedback regarding the work performed and removal of deficiencies, if any, observed in their working.
6. The incidental expenses like small implements/dress or uniform etc. shall be borne / supplied by the service provider at its own cost.
7. The day to day functioning of the services shall be carried out in consultation with and under direction of the Authority. Proposals for efficient functioning of

the security systems shall be discussed, considered and implemented from time to time by the Service provider with the approval of the Authority. Any loss caused to the Authority due to the lapse on the part of the personnel discharging responsibilities, will be borne by the Service provider and in this connection, the Authority shall have the right to deduct appropriate amount from the bill of the Service provider to make such loss besides imposition of penalty. In case of frequent lapses on part of the personnel deployed by the Service provider, Authority shall be within its right to terminate the contract or take any other action without assigning any reason whatsoever.

8. The entire financial liability in respect of manpower services deployed in the Authority's location shall be that of the Manpower Service Provider and the Authority will in no way be liable for the same. It will be the responsibility of the manpower Service Provider to pay to the person deployed a sum not less than the proposed monthly remuneration as mentioned in the financial bid.
9. The Manpower Service Provider shall provide a substitute well in advance if there occurs any probability of the person leaving the job due to his/her own personal reasons. The payment in respect of the overlapping period of the substitute shall be the responsibility of the Manpower Service Provider.
10. The persons deployed shall, during the course of their work be privy to certain qualified documents and information which they are not supposed to divulge to third parties. In view of this, they shall be required to take oath of confidentiality and breach of this condition shall make the Manpower Service Provider as well as the person deployed liable for penal action under the applicable laws besides, action for breach of contract.
11. The Manpower Service Provider shall be responsible for compliance of all statutory provisions relating to minimum wages payable to the persons deployed at the Authority's location. The service provider should ensure regular payment of monthly salary to the personnel engaged by the service provider by 10th of the succeeding month after deduction of applicable statutory dues. The service provider should credit the monthly salary of its employees in their respective Bank Account.
12. The engagement of outsourced person shall be purely on contract basis. The Service Provider shall at all times make it absolutely clear to the outsourced personnel hired through them. Any outsourced personnel deputed can be removed any time by giving notice to the Service Provider and the Service Provider will have to provide suitable replacement acceptable to Authority within 3 working days.

- iii. May provide Veterinary first aid services
- iv. Refer the case to the nearest Veterinary dispensary/ Vety. Hospital in case of requirement
- v. Work as per advise of assigned Block Veterinary Officer
- vi. Perform other Veterinary service related works (Like vaccination, AI, Health camps, necessity in case of natural calamities etc.) as assigned when not in call.
- vii. Assist in submission of Monthly report returns to BVO & other higher authorities as & when required.
- viii. Attend review meetings when required.
- ix. Any other duties relating to Veterinary service as & when required

3. Driver cum Attendant

- i. Drive & assist in attending the livestock in the assigned place with Veterinary doctor or livestock assistant.
- ii. Assist in providing applicable veterinary services
- iii. Work as per advise of assigned Block Veterinary Officer
- iv. Assist the Veterinary doctor / Livestock Assistant Perform other Veterinary service related works (Like vaccination, AI, Health camps, necessity in case of natural calamities etc.) as assigned when not in call.
- v. Any other duties relating to Veterinary service as & when required

SECTION - IV

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. For all intents and purposes, the Service Provider shall be the "Employer" within the meaning of different Rules & Acts in respect of persons deployed. The persons deployed by the service provider shall not have any claim whatsoever like employer and employee relationship against the Authority under this agreement. The Service Provider shall make them known about their position in writing before deployment under the required service.
2. Persons to be deployed by the Service Provider should be of age not exceeding 65 years and physically sound to perform the duties.
3. The Service Provider will be overall responsible for the manpower deployed for performing the service. The Authority shall not be responsible for any financial loss or any injury to any person deployed by the Service Provider in the course of their performing the functions/ duties, or for payment towards any compensation.
4. The Service Provider shall exercise adequate supervision to ensure performance of manpower deployed to provide the services in accordance with the requirements. The Service Provider shall depute one full time supervisor in concerned office of the authority, for overall management of the services to be rendered at the site.
5. The Service provider shall be solely responsible for compliance to the provisions of various Labour and industrial laws, such as, wages, allowances, compensation, EPF & ESI, Bonus and Gratuity etc. relating to manpower to be deployed by it at the Authority's location.
6. Service Provider shall maintain complete official records of disbursement of wage s/ salary showing details of all supporting documents such as ESI, EPF etc. in respect of manpower deployed for the purpose.
7. The Service Provider shall maintain personal file in respect of all the staff who are deployed in office of the authority. The personal file shall invariably consist of personal details such as name, address, date of birth, sex, residential address (temporary/permanent), Bank Account, EPF/ESIC details etc.
8. The manpower to be deployed by the Service Provider should not have any adverse Police records/criminal cases against them. The agency should make adequate enquiries about the character and antecedents of the persons whom they are recommending. An undertaking to this respect must be provided by the manpower service provider prior to signing of the agreement.
9. The Service Provider will also ensure that the manpower deployed are medically fit and will keep in record a certificate of their medical fitness. The Service Provider shall withdraw such manpower who are not found suitable by this office for any reasons immediately on receipt of such a request.

11. The Service Provider shall provide uniform along with Photo ID Card to its

- personnel deployed at site at its own cost.
12. The Authority shall not be liable for any compensation in case of any fatal injury/death caused to any man power while performing/discharging their duties/ for inspection or otherwise.
 13. In case of any theft or pilferages, loss or other offences, the service provider will investigate and submit the report to the Authority and maintain liaison with the police. FIR will be lodged by the Authority, wherever necessary. If need be, joint enquiry comprising of both the parties shall be conducted and responsibility will be fixed.
 14. In case of any loss caused to the Authority due to lapse on the part of the personnel discharging duties, the same shall be borne by the Service Provider. Authority shall have the right to deduct appropriate amount from the bill of service provider. In case of frequent lapses on the part of the personnel deployed by the service provider, Authority shall be within its right to terminate the contract or take any other action without assigning any reason whatsoever.
 15. In the event of any personnel being on leave/absent, the service provider shall ensure suitable alternative arrangements to make up for such absence. If a person leaves the job for any reason, the Service provider is liable to provide the suitable replacement within 3 working days.
 16. In case of delay in providing required replacement, the amount of penalty calculated **at the rate of 1%** of the annual contract value per week on account of delay, shall be deducted from the monthly bills in the succeeding month.
 17. There would be no increase in rates payable to the Service Provider during the Contract period. The service provider will be responsible for deposit of EPF, ESI, GST and other statutory dues as applicable from time to time and submit the proof of deposit to authority for records.
 18. The Service Provider shall not be allowed to transfer, assign, pledge or subcontract its rights and liabilities under this Agreement to any other agency or organization. Sub-contracting is not allowed under this agreement.
 19.  21. In case of dispute resolution relating to rights/liabilities arising out of the agreement, the same shall be disposed off at the level of Administrative Departments.
 22. In the event of failure of Service Provider to provide Services as per the terms and conditions of the agreement, the Performance Security shall be forfeited. Any violation of instructions/agreement or suppression of facts will attract termination of contract with 1 month prior notice to the Service Provider.

23. The Service provider should ensure that persons to be deployed are not alcoholic, drug addict and not indulge in any activity prejudicial to the interest of the Authority.
24. The Authority reserves the right to withdraw or relax any of the terms and condition mentioned above so as to overcome the problem encountered at a later stage.
25. In the event of any dispute arising in respect of the clauses of the agreement, the same shall be resolved through negotiation. Alternatively the dispute shall be referred to the next higher authority or controlling officer for his decision and the same shall be binding on all parties.
26. All disputes shall be under the jurisdiction of the court at **District Headquarters only.**
27. The agreement can be terminated by either party by giving one month's notice in advance. If the agency fails to give one month's notice in writing for termination of the agreement then one month's wages, etc. and any amount due to the service provider will be recovered by forfeiture of performance security.
28. The contract is liable to be terminated because of non-performance, deviation of any terms and conditions of agreement, non-payment of remuneration of manpower deployed and non-payment of statutory dues. The Authority will have no liability towards non-payment of remuneration to the persons deployed by the Service Provider and the outstanding statutory dues of the service provider to concerned authorities.
29. The Manpower Service Provider will be bound by the details furnished to the authority while submitting the tender or at any subsequent stage. Misrepresentation of documents/ information, leads to termination of agreement.
